

Today's psalm—Fr. Silvester O'Flynn OFMCap

There is a time to condemn and a time to affirm; a time to denounce and a time to announce. John prepared people by condemnation of wrongdoing but Jesus preferred to proclaim that God was already present in the deeds of goodness. Each verse of the Responsorial Psalm begins in the recognition of God's presence ... It is the Lord ... as the beloved disciple recognised the Risen Christ at the miraculous catch of fish. It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to the oppressed, who gives bread to the hungry, who sets prisoners free. The psalm gives a list of situations where God's presence can be seen. And it is through people that these works of God are done. The spirituality of Advent encourages us to be more attentive to the presence of God in our everyday life. Today's psalm inspires us in two ways;

- to be more attentive to the goodness of people and to recognise how God is working through them;
- to offer ourselves to God each day as co-workers for justice, peace, compassion and liberation.

It is the Lord And the Lord is counting on you.

As a very important part of our preparations for the celebration of The Lord's Nativity, the parish **Christmas Penitential Service** will be celebrated this Wednesday 19th December at 7.30pm. There will be a number of visiting priests to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Parish choir will also join in the celebrations.

On Thursday Manor House invite you to join in their annual **Carol Service** at 12 noon. This is always a very beautiful event here in the parish church and we extend an invitation to all to join in singing some favourite Christmas Hymns and Carols and listening to a few new ones as well.
