### WALK to MASS for IRAQI CHRISTIANS

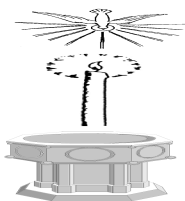
Catholics throughout Ireland have been asked to walk to Mass, this Sunday, in a symbolic gesture of solidarity with the Christian community in Iraq.

### THE DEEP END : An Open Book

*The Christian is a living epistle, known and read by all, an open letter, an advertisement for Christianity.*

What would an advertisement for Christianity look like? If you had to design one to sum up your faith, what would you include? On the one hand we are called to be joyful – to sing, shout, clap and rejoice! But faith is not always so straightforward. There are many obstacles and temptations. Sometimes we are afraid to stand up for what we believe in. Then there's today's Gospel, which speaks of suffering, and tells us that following Jesus involves taking up our cross. How do we make sense of this in the context of our faith journey?

The good news is we are not alone in our struggles. In today's First Reading, Jeremiah struggles with his faith in one of his many 'laments'. His faith has caused him to be a laughing stock. He feels conflicted; although his faith is inviting insult and derision, it is a fire burning in his heart. In spite of people's hostile reactions, he has been 'seduced' by God, and can't but speak out.

Is this how we feel about our faith? Is it like a fire burning within us, in our very bones, or are we lukewarm in our commitment? Following Jesus is a radical choice, now more than ever perhaps. Today's readings teach us to be less concerned with what people think, and more concerned with living according to Jesus' teachings.
