

MUSINGS

The Swiss Reformed theologian and pastor, Karl Barth (1886-1968), famous for his scholarly writings and whom Pope Pius XII called the most important theologian since Thomas Aquinas, engaged in frequent ministry to the inmates of Basel prison. While a professor at the University of Basel he preached in the local prison because, he noted, 'there people need firm contact with real life; at the same time the gospel becomes remarkably relevant and natural of its own accord'. One writer has speculated that when Barth reached the heavenly gates, a banquet was prepared for him not by those who had read his theology, but by the prisoners he had visited on a Sunday morning.
