

Questions People Ask

Q. Why is there a circle like a halo on the Celtic Cross?

A. The cross represents death while the circle, being a line without beginning or end, represents eternal like. The bare cross has lines coming in from all directions, clashing at the centre. In this view, Jesus is the innocent victim at the centre of the storm stirred up by envy, political ambition, misplaced nationalism, betrayal etc. If one views the cross as lines coming out from the centrepoint, then it portrays the explosion of new life that was the resurrection. This was the understanding of the Celtic monks, so they added the circle of eternity to the cross.
